# 4. The Early Middle Ages – from 451 - 1054

Ephesians 2:4-9, But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, <sup>5</sup> even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ- by grace you have been saved- <sup>6</sup> and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, <sup>7</sup> so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. <sup>8</sup> For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, <sup>9</sup> not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

## 1. THE FIFTH AND SIXTH CENTURIES

# (a) Political fragmentation

The west: Barbarians! Alaric sacks Rome in 410

Eastern Empire centred on Constantinople

#### (b) Church divisions

East continues to debate Christology... doctrine of salvation clearly Pelagian

West: Augustine (officially) wins... though semi-Pelagianism ever present

- (c) In the East: Emperor Justinian Caesaropapism
- (d) In the West: Pope Gregory the Great papal monarchy

### 2. The ninth century

- (a) In the East: Muslims, missionaries and icons
- (b) In the West: consolidation and Charlemagne

### (c) More church divisions!

How do you get saved? Justification... or deification

"Filioque" (and from the Son) → great split → Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches

### 3. Monasticism

#### (a) What?

E.g. St Anthony, Simeon the Stylite, Benedict of Nursia

Purity, self-denial, pursuit of God, no private property, rigorous discipline

#### (b) Why?

No more persecution!

Deny the body to purify the soul

Barbarians, disorder and mayhem!

## (c) Evaluation

Positively: (i) Focus on Christ; (ii) Evangelistic endeavor – Patrick, Martin, Boniface; (iii) Preserved orthodox theology; (iv) Provided community services

Negatively: (i) Soteriology: legalistic, synergistic, view of salvation; (ii) Engagement with the world? (iii) Ripe for corruption.
