their dreams.

Joseph asks the Cupbearer to remember him when he goes back to the palace but

**forgets.**

# fruitfulness

in affliction:

Two years later, Pharaoh has some strange dreams that no-one understands. The cupbearer

# remembers

Joseph and he is brought in to Pharaoh. Joseph explains that it is God who is making him able to

# understand

the dreams and it is God who is going to make the things to happen that Pharaoh dreamed about. Joseph tells Pharaoh what

he should do about it. Pharaoh then gives

Joseph the **job** of making it

happen.

So what should we learn?

1. When things are **hard**

we should remember God is faithful and we should keep on serving him.

2. When things are hard, we should

**look** to Jesus, the perfect saviour.
